Learn & Work™ will empower older individuals to live the remaining years of their lives in their own home, as many prefer, and provide training and job opportunities for individuals in the community seeking a better life for themselves and their families.

UHC Management projects the program will create an economic impact of \$2.5M to drive financial security and income stability in the community as well as alleviate a long-plagued staffing shortage in the home health industry that the pandemic has intensified, according to the latest projections released by the US Bureau of Labor Statistics.
